LENGTH OF TERM

ACADEMIC GRADES FROM PARTNER INSTITUTIONS

Beginning in Fall 2007, grades for general education courses from a partner institution applied to programs offered at an STC branch campus are included in grade point averages.

REPEATED COURSES

Students may elect to repeat courses completed at State Technical College of Missouri. The higher grade earned will be utilized in computing the cumulative grade point average; however, the lower grade will remain as a matter of transcript record. When this occurs, it will be indicated on the transcript. See the current catalog for additional information.

ACADEMIC HONORS

A full-time student (at least 12 credit hours per semester) who earns a semester grade point average of 3.500 to 4.000 will be placed on the Dean's List, and one who earns a semester grade point average of 3.000 to 3.499 will be placed on the Honor Roll.

In addition to the academic grades listed on transcripts, beginning in Fall 2009, a job readiness work ethic score and an attendance percentage are issued for each eligible course completed.

ASSESSMENT

All associate degree-seeking students are required to take the CAAP test, a general education assessment test. Students earning scores that place them in the 50th to 79th percentile nationally on three of the five areas tested earn the honor of "Distinction" on their STC transcripts. Students earning scores that place them in at least the 80th percentile nationally on three of the five areas tested earn the honor of "High Distinction" on their transcripts.

GRADUATION GPA REQUIREMENTS

To earn an Associate of Applied Science degree or Certificate, a student must earn a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.000, a departmental grade point average of at least 2.000, and no grade lower than a D in required courses.
